Identifying Sparrow-like Birds in grasslands of Southeastern Arizona

First, taking into account your **surrounding habitat** and **season**, you can often greatly limit the possibilities.

Next, inspect the bird's **structure/appearance**, does it appear smaller, chunkier, are the tails and wings long? Along with **behaviors** which are often distinctive to group, this should all help to identify the bird to a genus at this point.

Finally, careful inspection of the **plumage** combined with any **vocalizations**, should allow you to confirm its identification to a single species.
